As Mathematicians we will be continuing our fractions learning with a focus on adding and subtracting fractions and mixed numbers.

As Readers we will continue our exciting

We will then look at the formal written methods for multiplication and division. We will then apply this new learning to reasoning and problem solving questions. We will be working hard!

Steps to Read journey with a new diverse range of literature to inspire us: Victorians Eyewitness, Victorians How They Made Things Work, Poetry (Song of the Shirt by Thomas Hood and Christmas

Poetry (Song of the Shirt by Thomas Hood and Christmas Day in the Workhouse by George R. Sims), Street Child and A Christmas Carol.

We will continue to learn about root words, prefixes and suffixes, make predictions and comparisons and identify how punctuation relates to sentence structure and contributes to the meaning of texts. We will be busy with all that wonderful reading to do!

As Writers we will use the original text 'The Hound of the Baskervilles' by Arthur Conan Doyle and a graphic novel of the story to inspire us: Beware of the dog...Will Sherlock Holmes and Doctor Watson discover the truth behind the legend of the fearsome beast with blazing eye and dripping jaws? Among other things we will look at relative clauses, adverbial phrases, semi-colon use, metaphor use and effective language choices to create description that creates an intended mood. Our writing will culminate in two final pieces of work—a cliff hanger narrative and a formal event report.


As Artists we will link to our work on the Victorians by learning the creative technique of printing! We will also look at Victorian architecture and use this to inspire a building design project.
